We are confident that ParentSquare will enhance our partnership with families by making communication more efficient, consistent, and accessible.



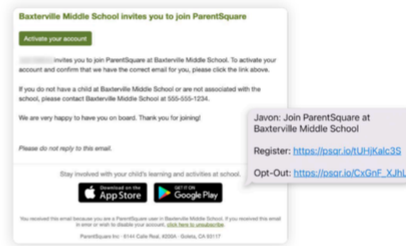
## Getting Started with ParentSquare for Parents and Guardians

Welcome to ParentSquare! This guide will help you activate your account, find helpful resources, and download the free ParentSquare app so you can start receiving updates from your school.

### Activate your ParentSquare account

Your school will send you an invitation using your email address or phone number on file.

1. Open the invitation from ParentSquare in your email or text messages.
2. Click **Activate your account** or tap the link to go to the account registration page.
3. Enter your email or phone number, then click **Get Started**.  
*(Optional: You can also sign in with Google or Microsoft.)*



4. Check your contact information. If it looks correct, click **Confirm**. You'll receive a code by text or email.
5. Enter the verification code when asked.
6. You'll see your children's names. Click **Confirm** next to each child who should be connected to your account.  
*If a child is listed by mistake, click **Not my child**.*
7. If everything looks correct, click **Yes, this is me**.

Now you're ready to start using ParentSquare!

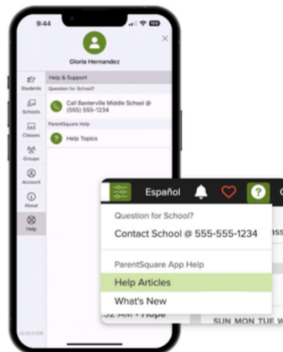

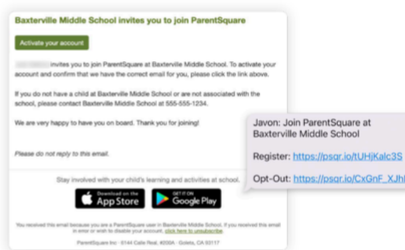
## Cómo empezar a usar ParentSquare para padres y tutores legales

### Active su cuenta de ParentSquare

Su escuela le enviará una invitación usando la dirección de correo electrónico o el número de teléfono que tenga registrado.

1. Abra la invitación de ParentSquare en su correo electrónico o mensaje de texto.
2. Pulse **Activar cuenta** o pulse el enlace para ir a la página de registro de la cuenta.

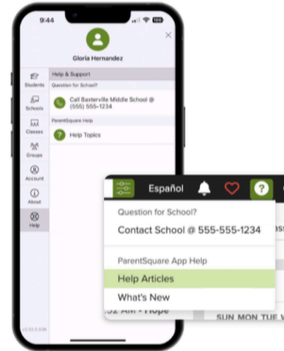

## Upcoming Changes to Student Technology Use (Kansas Law HB 20299)

As part of our continued commitment to providing a focused, Christ-centered learning environment, we want to make families aware of an upcoming change for the 26-27 school year regarding student use of personal electronic devices.

In alignment with the new House Bill 2299 and our school's expectations, students will not have access to personal electronic devices (including cell phones and smart watches) during the school day.

Students may bring devices to school if needed; however, they will be required to store them in a designated location and will not have access to them during the school day. Additional details about our specific procedures will be shared later this summer.

As we prepare for this change, our best recommendation is simple: **if possible, students should not bring personal devices to school.**

We are grateful for your partnership as we continue to cultivate a school environment that reflects our core values of nurturing relationships, cultivating knowledge, and supporting the well-being of every student.

**Please note, uniform skirts are only for girls in grades 5-8, skorts can be worn K-8 and jumpers are for students K-4. All the uniform guidelines will be gone over with students at the beginning of the school year. If there are any questions, please reach out. Thank you.**

## DRESS & UNIFORM POLICY

Our uniform policy is designed to promote not only a neat and orderly appearance, but also a sense of Catholic community. Students will be expected to take pride and responsibility in being dressed appropriately at all times. Uniform items may be purchased from **Tommy Hilfiger**. **Dennis Uniforms, Garfield Plaid, purchased in previous years are still allowed. All other companies are not part of our uniform policy.**

### Girls Uniform Requirements

-uniform plaid jumpers (K-4th Grade)

-uniform plaid skorts (K-8th Grade)

-uniform plaid skirts (5th-8th Grade)

Skirts and skorts should be modest in length, at least 2" below the fingertips, when arms are straight down. Hems shall not be pinned, stapled, and waistbands may not be rolled. Navy, black or white tights or leggings may be worn under uniform when weather indicates. Leggings should be plain (no designs or cut outs) tight-fitting and ankle length.

**Shirts K-8:** White, navy, light blue or red, collared, knit shirts, long or short-sleeved, with or without logos. When weather indicates, turtlenecks in the same color as the shirt may be worn. All shirts must be worn tucked in at all times. For daily wear, girls should wear shorts under their uniform skirt or jumper, but they should not be visible.

**Slacks K-8:** Navy slacks; parochial uniform type may be worn instead of jumpers and skirts, and may be paired with any approved shirts or sweatshirts. Uniform shorts (navy, walking length) may be worn before November 1, and after Spring Break. Traditional belts must be worn, free from chains, hooks, key rings, or hanging items for students in grades 3rd -8th. No cargo slacks or shorts.

### Boys Uniform Requirements

**Pants K-8:** Parochial style, plain navy blue slacks, traditional pockets, and belt loops may be worn. Pants may not have split seams at bottom of legs, studs, rivets, or zippered pockets. All slacks must be worn at the waist. Traditional belts must be worn, free from chains, hooks, key rings, or

hanging items. Uniform shorts (navy, walking length) may be worn before November 1, and after Spring Break. No cargo slacks or shorts.

**Shirts K-8:** White, navy, light blue or red, collared, knit shirts, long or short-sleeved, with or without logos. Turtlenecks in the same color as the shirt may be worn. All shirts must be worn tucked in at all times.

**General Guidelines: Boys and Girls:**

**Sweatshirts:** St. Paul Sweatshirts/ quarter zips are available for purchase throughout the year and may be worn with a uniform shirt; Students may also wear the navy blue cardigan or pullover sweaters or sweater vests purchased from Dennis Uniform with the St. Paul logo. No other sweatshirts, sweaters, jackets or coats may be worn in the classroom. Sweatshirts may not be worn tied or wrapped around the waist or body.

**Socks:** Socks are required. They should be visible and plain white, navy blue, or black.

**Shoes:** Athletic/ tennis shoes, lace-up or Velcro rubber soled shoes are allowed—No clogs, crocs, flip-flops, sandals, platforms, slippers, boots, moccasins, or slip-ons. (Because of the variety of shoes available, the acceptability for shoe style will be at the discretion of the principal. If you have questions about the style being appropriate for school, please discuss with the principal before purchase.)

**Hair:** Hairstyles are to be moderate. Boys' hair must be above the collar, ears and above the eyebrows (this will be strictly enforced). Designs may not be shaved into the hair. No mohawks or similar styles. Hair cannot be dyed or bleached an unnatural color. There can be no unnatural highlights or feathers. Girl headbands and barrettes must be conservative and not distracting. Boys must be clean-shaven.

**Jewelry:** Jewelry is not to be excessive or distracting. Girls may wear small stud earrings only (no hoops). Boys may not wear any type of piercing. Girls may wear one bracelet or watch and one ring. Boys may not wear bracelets, however a traditional watch is acceptable.

**Make Up:** Girls in 7th and 8th grade may wear minimal makeup. Girls are encouraged to have a "clean, fresh look" which could include light blush, neutral eye shadow and black/brown mascara. Eye -liner and bright lipstick are not allowed and the final decision of what is acceptable rests with the principal. No glitter or tattoos (permanent or temporary) are allowed. This includes students writing/drawing on themselves.

## Immunization Update

The attached policy related to immunization requirements for our schools has been revised to clarify the process for submission of documentation related to compliance as well as for requesting medical exemptions.

In the coming year, a more complete review of this policy as well as other school policies will be conducted. More information will be provided later in the year to explain additional changes to existing policies and new ones that may be promulgated as a result of this review.

Any student enrolling in a Catholic school in the Archdiocese of Kansas City in Kansas for the first time, when such enrollment is also the student's first enrollment in any school in Kansas, shall present to the principal or designee certification that the student has completed, is in the process of completing, or is exempt from completing tests and inoculations as are deemed necessary by Kansas's Secretary of the Department of Health and Environment. See K.S.A. 72-6261 (Kansas Statutes Related to School Immunizations Requirements) and K.A.R. 28-1-20 (Immunizations: Schools, Child Care Facilities, and Preschool or Child Care Programs Operated by a School). Certification forms are available on the Kansas Department of Health and Environment website.

Prior to admission to and attendance at school, a parent or guardian must provide to the principal or designee the necessary documentation for one of the following:

1. **Completion:** Certification from a physician or local health department that the student has received such tests and inoculations as are deemed necessary;
2. **In-Progress:** Certification from a physical or local health department that the student has received the most recent appropriate inoculations in all required series; or
3. **Exemption** documentation in compliance with #7060.1.

Students that have received the most recent inoculation in a series may enroll or remain enrolled while completing the requirement inoculations. Failure to certify completion of these tests and inoculations, failure to complete catch-up doses, or failure to complete the in-progress inoculation services in a timely manner shall be deemed non-compliance with this policy.

Upon written notice, the governing authority, superintendent, or the principal reserves the right to deny admittance or exclude a student from school attendance for failure to comply with this policy until the student is in compliance. Before making a decision regarding school admittance or exclusion, principals shall consult with the superintendent of Catholic Schools.

Written notice to parents of non-compliance with this policy will include the reason for the student's exclusion from school attendance, notify the parents that the student will continue to be excluded from attendance until the student has complied with the requirements of this policy, and inform the parent or guardian of their right to request a hearing regarding this policy.

Circumstances involving students who are unable to provide immediate certification under policy #7060 due to homelessness or are in the household of an active duty military member will be addressed in accordance with state and federal law.

**Vacunas, Pruebas e Inmunizaciones**

**#7060**

Cualquier estudiante que se inscriba por primera vez en una escuela católica de la Arquidiócesis de Kansas City en Kansas, y cuya inscripción también represente su primera inscripción en cualquier escuela en Kansas, deberá presentar al director o a la persona designada una certificación que indique que el estudiante ha completado, está en proceso de completar, o está exento de completar las pruebas e inmunizaciones consideradas necesarias por el Secretario del Departamento de Salud y Medio Ambiente de Kansas. Consulte K.S.A. 72-6261 (Estatutos de Kansas Relacionados con los Requisitos de Inmunización Escolar) y K.A.R. 28-1-20 (Inmunizaciones: Escuelas, Guarderías y Programas Preescolares o de Cuidado Infantil Operados por una Escuela). Los formularios de certificación están disponibles en el sitio web del Departamento de Salud y Medio Ambiente de Kansas.

Antes de la admisión y asistencia a la escuela, el padre, madre o tutor deberá proporcionar al director o a la persona designada la documentación necesaria para una de las siguientes opciones:

**Completado:** Certificación de un médico o departamento local de salud indicando que el estudiante ha recibido las pruebas e inmunizaciones requeridas;

**En proceso:** Certificación de un médico o departamento local de salud indicando que el estudiante ha recibido las inmunizaciones más recientes apropiadas dentro de todas las series requeridas; o

**Documentación de exención** en cumplimiento con la política #7060.1.

Los estudiantes que hayan recibido la inmunización más reciente de una serie pueden inscribirse o permanecer inscritos mientras completan las inmunizaciones requeridas. La falta de certificación de finalización de estas pruebas e inmunizaciones, la falta de completar las dosis de refuerzo necesarias, o la falta de completar oportunamente las inmunizaciones en proceso será considerada como incumplimiento de esta política.

Mediante notificación por escrito, la autoridad correspondiente, el superintendente o el director se reservan el derecho de negar la admisión o excluir a un estudiante de la asistencia escolar por no cumplir con esta política hasta que el estudiante cumpla con los requisitos. Antes de tomar una decisión sobre la admisión o exclusión escolar, los directores deberán consultar con el superintendente de Escuelas Católicas.

La notificación por escrito a los padres sobre el incumplimiento de esta política incluirá la razón de la exclusión del estudiante de la asistencia escolar, informará a los padres que el estudiante continuará excluido hasta cumplir con los requisitos de esta política, y notificará al padre, madre o tutor sobre su derecho a solicitar una audiencia relacionada con esta política.

Las circunstancias de estudiantes que no puedan proporcionar certificación inmediata bajo la política #7060 debido a falta de vivienda o por pertenecer al hogar de un miembro activo de las fuerzas armadas serán atendidas conforme a las leyes estatales y federales.
